Getting to Know You – “Lisa Montesanti”

I would like to introduce you to Lisa Montesanti, not your stereotypical Homemaker, or perhaps she is the 2019 version of a Homemaker! Lisa and her husband Steve have been married for 42 years, they have three children ages 42, 40 and 35 and four grandchildren age 15, 4, 8 and 6. She helps care for her 85 year old mother who resides in Sierra Madre, as well as her 15 year old grandson Nick who is autistic, and who along with her youngest daughter reside with her and Steve.



Starting their family at an early age Lisa quickly became Steve's helpmate with his business, Quality Carpet Care along with looking after their growing family. Growing up with a single mother, the women of the household learned to become self-reliant, which resulted in Lisa not being intimidated by taking on many tasks which might traditionally have fallen to the "man of the house." For instance, she has done sprinkler installation and repairs, fixed plumbing problems, completed electrical work, patched drywall, repaired her dishwasher and ice maker, just to name a few. After all, who needs a handyman when an instructional YouTube video can provide a "how to" guide for repairs.

While foraging into what used to be non-traditional woman's projects, Lisa is very accomplished at more traditional skills. She learned how to sew beginning at an early age from her grandmother, and now sews many items of her wardrobe. While her favorite item to bake is sourdough bread, she has started a home-based baking business, which the Woman's Club benefits from at our meeting raffles ... yummy. She experiments with various milk substitute products due to dietary issues in her household, and highly recommends A2 milk. Her mother who was a commercial artist / illustrator, who taught her how to paint, resulting in a current "work in progress" mural in her family room of one of her favorite places – Hawaii.

Lisa grew up in West Covina and Pasadena, eventually moving to Arcadia where she attended Oak Avenue and Temple City High School. In 1986 Steve and Lisa won the lottery, which afforded them the chance to purchase their own home on Wedgewood in Temple City. In 2002, they decided to look for a new home, thinking of moving out of Temple City, when they found their current home on Golden West. This beautiful craftsman home may have needed a little TLC, but Lisa and Steve were up to the task. Their home is the original residence of what is now a multi-home lot, but was formerly a chicken farm. Walking in the door you immediately know you are in a beautiful, unique, and cozy family home. During the day you are likely to find Lisa this time of year cozying up in front of the fire with a good book, watching her favorite soap opera, General Hospital, cooking/baking, or helping Nick with a project.

In warmer weather, Lisa who grew up sailing, might be found out with Steve enjoying a day on the water or a swim in their pool. That is, if she hasn't run away to Hawaii!

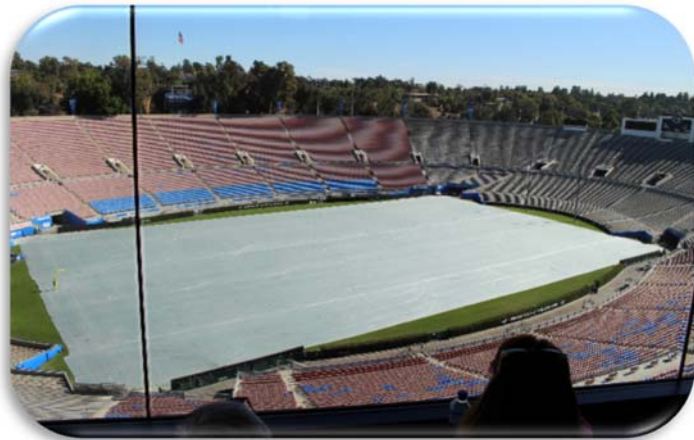

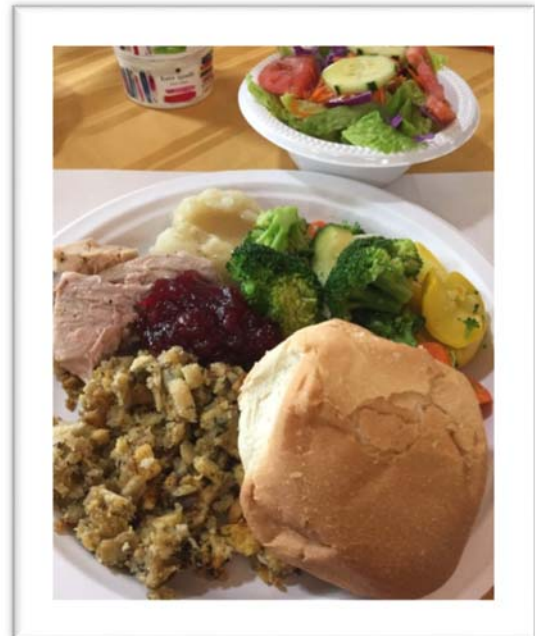
