That is a 500% increase in membership. This increase is because the Club changed, included men, expanded activities, had the first ever Community Christmas Party, a Baked Potato Booth at the Concerts in the Park, added the Auxiliaries for evening events and outings, along with sweaters, shirts, aprons, and name tags available to order. We have been featured in Connect and Temple City Life. In 2019 the club was named Grand Marshall for the Camellia Festival. We have come along way, thanks to the vision of our former and current members over the years.
