Getting to Know You "Bobbie McGowan"

I'm trying to recall when I first met Bobbie McGowan, which was sometime in the last ten years. I had no idea she was a former member of our City Council from 1990-94, or anything else really about her. I did, however, recognize her name. When the opportunity arose during our brief meetings at various events, I always tried to tease out something new about Bobbie, so I decided to have a "sit down" with her to learn even more about her, and share with everyone a little bit about Woman's Club member Bobbie McGowan.



Bobbie is a true local of Temple City. A member of Temple City High School's first graduating class, she then continued in Temple City Schools as a teacher for 30 years at La Rosa and Longden Elementary Schools. She also taught in Germany for two years and Santa Clara for two years. She was both President, Vice-President, and negotiator for the teacher's union. Her three sisters graduated from Temple City High School and she and her husband raised their son in Temple City. It is not possible to talk about Bobbie without bringing up the fact that she is very involved in the Democratic Party. That being said, she is more than happy to have an open conversation with

anyone regardless of party affiliation. She has attended the State Conventions every year since 1990 and even attended a recent National Convention. When we met for lunch, she had recently completed a round of interviews with local candidates who were being vetted for endorsement. She is a Board Member on the National Women's Political Caucus as well as many other organizations. She has been recognized and awarded by many organizations for her dedication and work over the years, too many times for her to recall each and every one.

Bobbie is a determined individual and you would hardly know that only a few years ago she was in a terrible car accident resulting in five fractures and months in a brace and recovery. Most recently she had surgery for trigger finger – physical therapy is something she is intimately familiar with. Perhaps having a physician for a son is a benefit when you are recovering, it is too bad he lives in San Bernardino County. Yet since her husband passed away in 1994, Bobbie remains independent in her lovely home near Live Oak Park and has a handle on using Lyft and using other technology. She is a frequent poster to Facebook.

While our Yearbook states that Bobbie has been a member of the Woman's club since June of 2006, she was also a member of the Temple City Woman's Club Junior Division where she worked on many projects, including digging the Live Oak Park children's wading pool.

Don't think that you can pigeonhole Bobbie into a single category; yes, she spends a time with her political organizations, but she is also on the board of the Monrovia Garden Club, Pacific Rose Society, and is an active member of the Los Angeles County Arboretum. I encourage you to take the time to get to know Bobbie, I know I have only scratched the surface of the multi-dimensional octogenarian.


