
Woman's Club Care Packages & "Will You Be My Valentine?" & Camellia Festival General Meetings

Four hundred years ago, in 1620, the Mayflower embarked on a journey to bring families to New England. They came for different reasons, but together, the Pilgrims would plant the seeds of a new Nation. Enduring hardships, they agreed to work together for the common good and built Plymouth Colony.

Historical Society

Carole Curran and Jane Wong will share about this remarkable journey, the Mayflower Compact and clothing styles of the Pilgrims. Both Carole and Jane are direct descendants of the passengers of the Mayflower and members of the General Society of Mayflower Descendants.

Carole Curran is the Governor of the local Foothill Colony of Mayflower Descendants, and served as the Float Chair for "The Voyage of Hope – 1620" float in the 2020 Rose Parade®. Jane Wong is Recording Secretary of the Foothill Colony and served as Clothing Coordinator for the float. The float won the "Americana Award" for the most outstanding best depiction of National treasures and traditions and the riders were dressed in period-correct clothing, researched by Jane Wong.
