The City of Temple City will celebrate Veterans Day on November 11, 2020. The celebration will commence with a vintage plane flyover. The flyover will be viewable from your home within the

boundaries of Temple City (weather permitting). The flyover will begin at 11:00 A.M., and the duration of the flyover is approximately fifteen minutes. After the flyover, the City will be premiering its first virtual Veterans Day ceremony at 11:15 A.M. The celebration will take time to pause and recognize the brave men and women who have fearlessly and faithfully defended the United States and our freedom. The celebration will include an inspirational message from our keynote speaker as well as messages for local dignitaries and elected officials.

Additionally, Temple City residents can also participate in the festivities in two ways. The first is by submitting a photo of a veteran and or current service member to be used in a commemorative slide show. The focus of the slide show is to honor all those that have served. The slide show will follow the virtual Veterans Day ceremony. The second way residents can participate in the celebration is by displaying a Veterans Day lawn sign. The signs are designed to show support to Temple City veterans with a message of "Remembering all who served". Lawn signs will be available for delivery November 2nd, or sooner.

Here is information for this Holiday Season for Door of Hope & Friends of Foster Children:



Founded in 1985, their mission is to equip families and children experiencing homelessness to rebuild their lives. Unlike most homeless service organizations where families are separated, the Door of Hope program keeps the family unit together as they work towards their end goal of achieving permanent housing. Door of Hope has an 82% success rate with families who graduate from the program.

Friends of Foster Children (FOFC) has been serving foster children in the San Gabriel Valley since 1976. Several of our Club Members are members of this organization whose purpose is to “help make a foster child’s life a little brighter.” FOFC is an all-volunteer 501(c)(3) organization. They have no paid staff and no facility, so less than 6% of their annual budget is spent on operating costs. A total of 94% of every donated dollar is applied to the children’s needs. Various fundraisers and gift collections throughout the year are designed to help foster children in residential treatment centers in the San Gabriel Valley. They also assist newly emancipated foster teens as they learn to set up their own homes, continue their education, and begin their journey of being self-supporting.
