Getting to Know You – "Ann Seitz" by Dawn Tarin

Faith, Family and Friends ... are the three words that I believe best describe Ann Seitz. Most of us know her as a constant at Woman's Club meetings, and as our Parliamentarian; but did you know that four to five times a month she answers a call to service at the Diocesan Council? A quick Google search confirmed what I already knew - that Ann is a woman of substance who should, and has been recognized for her service by the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles whose motto is "Feeding Hungry Hearts" [from their website]:

"From time to time, the Bishop names clergy and laypersons honorary canons of the Cathedral Center of St. Paul . . . in recognition of significant service to the larger Church (bestow) the title *"canon"* which dates from medieval times to denote *a key advisor to a bishop or a cathedral community...* Following are listed honorary canons of the Cathedral Center of St. Paul . . . 2016 Canon **Ann Seitz**"



"Key advisor" is most certainly a term I would bestow on Ann myself. As a comparative veteran of the Camellia Festival, joining the committee in 2007 handling the Royal Court wardrobe, she later became Royal Governess. As Royal Governess I have perhaps interacted with her on a more regular basis since becoming Festival Director in late 2015, than any other committee member. She is always a willing sounding board and source of knowledge.

At Woman's Club meetings Ann frequently is seen sharing a table with her close friends Kathy Mushinskie and Annette Constantino, these three now work together on the Camellia Festival Royal Court Wardrobe, but dressing ten First Graders is, I'm sure, simple when compared to dressing the entire cast of a Temple City High School Musical production. Ann's sewing skills are not limited to wardrobe though, she also currently belongs to two quilt guilds, and when visiting her to prepare this article I was shown some of the intricate craftmanship that goes into her quilt making. Her needlework is to be envied, and something that she has been doing since she was young.

Ann is a "local girl," graduating from San Gabriel High School and attending Pasadena City College. In the early 1960s she began working at the Huntington Sheraton Hotel where she met the love of her life, Jim Seitz, who left her too early in November of 2012. She stopped working with the arrival of the first of their three children Elizabeth (of the beautiful voice!) who lives with her husband in Ohio and is a teacher. Joe who lives with his wife and two daughters who are now in college, in Anchorage Alaska, who is also a teacher; and Bill who lives with his wife in Chicago and is the proud parent of the adorable Henry whom (those of us who are Facebook friends with Ann) get to see on a regular basis. His smile can truly make your day. Family is very important to Ann, and even with her children spread throughout the states, she takes time to visit them often. In fact, she and Kathy Mushinskie will have taken a trip to Boston, Detroit, and Chicago in late October, which will include Ann visiting two of her three children and Kathy (I believe) visiting her own son.

Our Woman's Club consists of women from many backgrounds, but there is a strong thread tied to the Temple City Unified School District, Ann is part of this thread. When she decided to return to work, her first job was as a classroom aid for a brand new first grade teacher by the name of Kathy Perini. She then went on to special education classrooms and in September of 1985, just after Elizabeth graduated, she began working at Temple City High School in the library/media center where she worked until she retired in 2003.

My son once told me that I was the busiest unemployed person he knew – well, he obviously did not know Ann! In addition to her work with the Diocesan Council, the TCHS musical, Camellia Festival, Woman's Club,

two quilt guild memberships, she participates in water aerobics three days a week, travels as much as possible, and recently committed to a five-year bible study class. This woman of many talents puts them all to good use, for which her family, friends, and community are very fortunate.

Ann is unique to our Woman's Club, and I believe may be one of only a handful who was a member of a Junior Woman's Club, joining the San Gabriel Junior Woman's Club in 1968 she is truly a veteran of the organization. In fact, while a member of the Junior Club, she attended an event at the Temple City Clubhouse in June of 1969, mere days before giving birth to her son Joe. The San Gabriel Club disbanded, and in February of 2016 she joined the Woman's Club of Temple City.

Should you have the chance to visit Ann at her gracious home, be prepared to be welcomed by her companion Sarah, a wonderfully well-behaved Goldendoodle.



Celebrate the Centennial of winning **Votes for Women** with this 55' long and 18' wide float.


