Let's all take this time to count our blessings. We are so lucky to have this chance to make 2023 whatever we want it to be!



Larry was also involved with Monrovia Unified School District as an elementary band director on and off for 14 years and also assisted the middle school music programs.



Humanitarian Award Recipient Mary Sneed

Mary Sneed is almost a hometown girl. Born in Lincoln Heights, her family moved to Temple City in 1959. They moved further into Temple City 3 years later to a home on Golden West. From there, they first enjoyed the Camellia Parade, as her father truly enjoyed parades and would go up every year to "stake out their seating site"

Mary attended St Luke's School then high school at Alverno Heights Academy. She earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts from Long Beach State before marrying her husband, Gene, who she calls her biggest cheerleader, in 1976. Mary and Gene are very proud of their three sons (all TCHS grads), their 3 "daughters" and their 4 grandchildren.





Raised by parents who instilled the idea that you need to give back, Mary became involved in her sons' activities, serving as a Den Mother and Committee member for Pack 156. She and Gene later became band parents at Oak Ave and later with the POTC, serving as Band Booster Presidents for 3 years. In honor of her father, she served as the 2011 Camellia Festival General Chairman, and has enjoyed being its Float Chairman for over 12 years.

During this same time, Mary returned to college to earn her teaching credential, and later returned to earn her Masters Degree as a Reading Specialist. In her career, she spent 5 years as an instructional aide and 25 years as a teacher, all at Longden Elementary. During those years, she was the Director of the 4th grade Heritage trip for 8 years and helped coordinate the Longden Geography Bee and Multicultural Night for many years before she retired in 2018.

Retirement turned out to be a busy time though. In honor of her father, who was lost to cancer 25 years ago, Mary became a part of the Relay for Life of Temple City during their first Relay and served as Event Chair for 3 years and also Luminaria Chair. She became a Woman's Club member and served as 1st Vice President before being elected President in 2021. She is serving her second term. As a member of the Historical Society of Temple City, Mary serves as the Curator/Museum Director and oversaw the recent renovation of their Museum. Mary was elected to the TCUSD Board of Education in 2020. She is grateful for this chance to give back to the students, staff and families of Temple City.




