Zoom Board Meeting

On May 21, 2020, the Woman's Club Board held its first "Zoom" Board meeting. It is always fun to learn something new! During the meeting, the following items were decided:

- All Future Meetings: June 11, 25 & July 16th are cancelled. At this time, there are no meeting or events schedule for the Woman's Club.
- Members who had pre-paid for lunch/dinner were notified of the option to donate the \$78 in unused funds to the Club or obtain a refund.
- The Community Christmas Party Scheduled for December 6, 2020 has been cancelled.
- Temple City's Concerts in the Park are cancelled, so there will not be a Baked Potato Booth this year.



- The Emergency Preparedness Signature Service Project is placed on hold.
- The 2020 Scholarship Committee is disbanded.
- In light of the loss of future income, it was decided by the Board to forego the majority of our annual donations at this time.
- From the “Crazy Dreams” Auxiliary Event hosted by Ann Seitz, \$350 was donated to the Temple City High School Performing Arts and \$345 to the Woman’s Club of Temple City.

Temple City's Newest Councilmember


Fernando Vizcarra was appointed by the City Council to fill the seat left open by the resignation of Nanette Fish.

Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 Order: Examples of What's Open in Los Angeles County

Through our Safer at Home efforts, we've collectively slowed the spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in Los Angeles County, allowing for a phased reopening of some businesses and public spaces. However, COVID-19 remains a serious risk. Please continue to practice social (physical) distancing and wear a facemask whenever you are around others, and to wash your hands frequently. - Stores that Sell Products Needed for Your Home, such as Hardware, Building, Home Appliance, and Pool Supply Stores
- Lower-Risk Retail Stores, such as Bookstores, Jewelry Stores, Furniture Stores, Toy Stores, and Clothing Stores
- Pet Food Stores, Animal Daycare and Boarding Facilities, and Veterinary Clinics
