

ATTENTION TEMPLE CITY RESIDENTS: NEW WASTE & RECYCLING PROGRAM

WHAT IS CHANGING?

Athens Services is advancing Temple City's waste and recycling program. Starting July 1, 2021 residential customers will be transitioning from a manual hand-tossed mixed-waste and green waste collection program, to a source separated waste, recycling, and green waste program.

WHY IS THIS HAPPENING?

Athens and Temple City are partnering to change the City's waste and recycling program to stay in compliance with California recycling laws.

ENHANCED RECYCLING

Increased recycling and reduced landfill waste through source separation

NEW CONTAINERS

Residents will receive three new 64-gallon containers

REDUCED TRAFFIC

Reduced traffic and wear on city streets with one service day

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE

State-mandated recycling program

DO I HAVE TO BUY NEW CONTAINERS?

No, Athens will provide customers a new set of containers as part of the new waste and recycling program. Each customer will receive a set of three 64-gallon containers: a black trash cart, a blue recycling cart, and a green waste green cart.

ARE MY PICK-UP DAYS CHANGING?

Yes, starting July 5th residential customers will be serviced 1 time per week. Athens will begin notifying customers of their new service days soon and will make service maps and more information available on AthensServices.com/TempleCity.
